The biogeography of the family Felidae is briefly discussed, explaining how early cats spread about the earth from their origins in Europe. Since these cats evolved in several lineages of related species, I emphasize the small cat lineage that produced <i>Felis silvestris</i>, the wild ancestor of today's domestic cat, <i>Felis catus</i>.
